## Basic Transition Statement:

Any course that counts towards the minor under the old list of requirements will count towards the new minor. If there is an equivalent course under the new minor, but with a new number, the student may not take it again.

Example: Suppose Student A took RELG 327 after declaring, but before the transition. RELG 327 will count as a one-for-one replacement of any complementary course of the new minor. Since RELG 356 is an equivalent course under the new minor, however, the student may not take RELG 356 toward the minor.

Example: Suppose Student B took PHIL331 before the transition. PHIL 331 will count towards the minor as a one-for-one replacement for any complementary course, even though there is no equivalent under the new minor.

<sup>(</sup>E) = A course under the new minor with an equivalent under the old.

Because of this policy, students who began the minor under trimesters might satisfy the requirements of the new minor with fewer than 20 credits:

Example: Suppose Student C completed RELG 203, PHIL 205, PHIL 323, and RELG 326 while on trimesters. Since each of these courses will count as a one-for-one replacement for courses under the new minor, this student would only need to take one additional course from the list of complementary courses on semesters to complete the minor. Thus, this student would complete the minor with 17 credits.
